WHERE TO STAY

Lefay Resort & SPA Dolomiti

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WHERE TO STAY

Casa di Langa

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WHERE TO STAY

The Place Firenze

An intimate townhouse where personalized service and tailored experiences define the stay. Individually styled rooms feel residential and refined, while the open kitchen and curated library-lounge create a sense of privacy and warmth.

Vocabolo Moscatelli

A restored 12th-century Umbrian monastery reimaged as a design-forward countryside retreat. Stone walls and arched cloisters contrast with minimalist interiors and curated contemporary art for an intimate and atmospheric sensibility.

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WHERE TO STAY

Hotel Chapter Roma

Bold and contemporary in the heart of Rome's historic center, with eclectic interiors. A lively rooftop bar and destination restaurant draw a creative crowd, while guest rooms balance edge with comfort. Energetic, stylish, and steps from Campo de' Fiori.

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WHERE TO STAY

Borgo Egnazia

Grand, village-style retreat inspired by traditional Puglian architecture, with white stone facades, winding lanes, and expansive sea views. Multiple pools, a private beach club, and championship golf create a full resort experience that's rooted in local culture.

San Domenico Palace, Taormina, A Four Seasons Hotel
